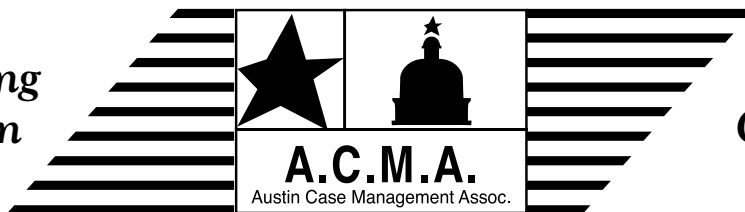

This month's meeting will NOT be held at North Austin Medical Center Auditorium. It will be held at The Heritage at Gaines Ranch at 4409 Gaines Ranch Loop on August 9. The meeting will begin at 11:45 a.m. preceded by lunch from approximately 11:15 - 11:45 a.m. Additional parking is available at the back of the property and at the LaQuinta Hotel right next door.

From the north, take MoPac (Loop 1) South. After passing the exit for Capital of Texas Highway (Route 360), exit Frontage Road. Take the first right at La Quinta onto Gaines Ranch Loop.

From the south, stay on the access road of MoPac (Loop 1) North. Pass Southwest Parkway and take the Turnaround over the freeway. After you cross over MoPac, continue straight onto Gaines Ranch Loop.

From I-35, take West Ben White Blvd. (Hwy 290/71) and exit at Capitol of Texas Highway (Route 360). Turn left onto MoPac (Loop 1) South. Take the first exit, Frontage Road and take the first right at La Quinta onto Gaines Ranch Loop.

There will be additional parking at the back of the property and at the LaQuinta Hotel right next door.

Our topic this month is "The Path To Easy Breathing," a very personal story told by our speaker **Sandy Norwood**. Sandy was working as a Certified Tissue Bank Specialist when an abrupt and devastating change in her health sent her down the path of needing a double lung transplant herself in 2009. Sandy not only presents her experiences as a transplant patient, but also answers questions about the donor and impact upon the donor's family.

Sandy Norwood is a retired licensed Funeral Director/Mortician and Certified Tissue Bank Specialist, and also has spent many years educating health care professionals and the public about Organ and Tissue Donation. Sandy has written and published a book about her transplant journey called "Breathing Easy...A Journey To Transplant". Now as a volunteer, Sandy continues to educate the community about organ and tissue donation and transplantation.

National Immunization Awareness Month

National Immunization Awareness Month is observed in August, sponsored by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, National Center for Immunization and Respiratory Diseases (<http://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/events/niam/default.htm>)

The Centers say immunizations aren't just for babies and young kids. Vaccinations help protect all of us from serious diseases and illness.

Young children:

- Children under age 6 get a series of shots to protect against measles, polio, chicken pox, and hepatitis.

Preteens:

- All 11- and 12-year-olds need shots to help protect against tetanus, diphtheria, whooping cough, and meningitis.
- Doctors recommend girls also get the HPV vaccine to protect against the most common cause of cervical cancer.

Adults:

- All adults need a tetanus shot every 10 years.
- Adults age 50 and older need a flu shot every year.
- People age 65 need a one-time pneumonia shot.
