Each session consists of two full days of instruction, and all practicum work must be documented in writing. Two sessions with clients must be videotaped for evaluation purposes. Continuing education units will be provided for social workers, nurses, licensed chemical dependency counselors and are being requested for certified care managers and certified guardians. The course will be taught by Vicki de Klerk-Rubin, B.A., M.B.A., C.V.M., an International Validation® Master who is a Registered Nurse (Dutch Equivalent) and the European Manager of the Validation® Training Institute.
